The Norfolk-based guided missile destroyer Conungham not only won the Battle Efficiency "E" and two departmental "E"s this year, but also posted the highest score recorded within the Force.

The coveted Battle Efficiency "E" is one of the most sought after honors among Atlantic Fleet ships. Yet only one ship in each squadron can win, and Conyngham took the honor in Destroyer Squad-

This is the second consecutive year that Conungham has won the "E". In addition, last year she won all four departmental awards and this year took "E's" in Weapons and Operations.

The "E" winner is determined by averaging grades for exercises conducted during the year. The exercises include gunnery, antisubmarine warfare, engineering, communications and operations as well as marks received for smartness and efficiency plus overall performance in fleet operations.

A youngster in the Cruiser-Destroyer Force. Conungham was commissioned on July 13, 1963. She is the third ship to be named Conyngham and is named in honor of Capt. Gustavus Conyngham of the Continental Navy.

The ship completed post shakedown availability in early March of 1964, then headed south for the Caribbean and Operation Springboard.

In August, Conyngham had a complete check of her equipment at the Norfolk Naval Shipyard, then set course for new adventures on her first Mediterranean cruise.

While in the Mediterranean, the ship conducted a vigorous people-to-people program, patrolled the Cyprus coast for possible evacuation of American personnel during the Cyprus-Turkish dispute, and carried out assigned Sixth Fleet operations.

More recently, the guided missile destroyer participated in Project Power in the Caribbean, and broke all existing records at the Atlantic Fleet Weapons Range in the number of missiles fired and number of hits recorded on drone targets. Additionally, she holds the Atlantic Fleet record for a surface gunnery shoot with a raw score of 425.72%.
